### LOCATION

Berwickshire is an unspoiled, hidden gem: an area rich in history and culture which offers many opportunities to explore the unique and varied countryside. Overlooking the harbour, why not start with Gunsreen House and immerse yourself in the fascinating tales of the smugglers who once plied their trade beneath the streets of Eyemouth.

The spectacular clear waters at Eyemouth and St Abbs Voluntary Marine Reserve are a mecca for divers from across the globe. For those who enjoy exploring dramatic shorelines and countryside, there is an abundance of bird and marine life. Coldingham Sands, a Blue Flag status beach is popular with families as well as surfers of all abilities.

There's no shortage of activities that you enjoy while in Eyemouth, whether land or marine based; facilities for diving, surfing, sea-angling, wildlife, bird watching, golfing, walking, swimming, gym, cycling and horse riding are all available locally. Alternatively you could just sit back and enjoy the atmosphere of the harbour from one of the cafes or the deck of your boat, while watching the seals and swans that choose to frequent the harbour.

### NAVIGATION

Eyemouth harbour is situated 55° 53N, 02° 5'28W on the South east coast of Scotland. Perfectly situated just south of the busy Firth of Forth, Eyemouth offers safe easy 24 hour access for leisure craft.

The Hurkar rocks at the entrance are marked by a North Cardinal mark. Pick up the leading line from the orange day marks or the green lights on the west pier. Once within the mouth of the harbour keep mid channel.

To pontoon; once inside the harbour pass the port and starboard beacons, proceed southerly to the inner harbour. The pontoon is on the port-hand side of the inner harbour. Please do not berth adjacent to the pontoon gangway as this area is a dedicated landing berth.
